Chinese Studies Bachelor of Arts is an interdisciplinary degree program that allows students interested in China to utilize the university's offerings in various departments while acquiring Mandarin Chinese language skills.

Major Requirements:

Equivalent of 2 years of Chinese Language courses

CHIN 10A-10B-10C
CHIN 20A-20B-20C

(Mandarin and Dialect speakers may not need to take all 2 years at UCSD based on placement test)

12 Upper Division Chinese Electives

3 Courses **MUST** be Upper Division Chinese History

Upper Division Electives:

Must be a combination of at least 3 **different** departments that offer Chinese Studies courses:

Examples: HIEA, LTEA, POLI, VIS, SOCI

All Upper Division Courses must be taken for a letter grade

1 of 12 Upper Division Courses MUST be a colloquium/seminar.

These courses are typically numbered HIEA 161-171

This course counts towards your Upper Division History Requirement
